## **County administrator to address Pasco landowners**

Pasco County Administrator John J. Gallagher will cover a wide range of fiscal and policy issues when he addresses the Thursday, Nov. 10, meeting of the Pasco Alliance of Community Associations (PACA).

The public is invited to attend PACA's Nov. 10 meeting. It begins at 7 p.m. at the Land O' Lakes Community Center. It is located at 5401 Land O' Lakes Blvd. (US 41), three miles north of SR 54.

Mr. Gallagher has served as county administrator since 1982, after a five-year stint as city administrator in New Port Richey. He holds a bachelor's degree in political science from St. Leo's College and a master's degree in public administration from American University.

PACA president Jim Flateau said, "The Board of County Commissioners and John Gallagher have charted Pasco's growth, which has included managing an unprecedented 35 percent increase in our population in just the past decade.
